
Christophe Gaillard Rencontre à La Boisserie

A dramatization of the encounter between General de Gaulle and Bernanos, which took place on December 5, 1946.


Christophe Gaillard imagines what was exchanged between the two men in the General's residence. De Gaulle deplores France's moral and intellectual climate, that its greatness is being undermined, its heroism discredited, its language disdained. And Bernanos, lost in an emerging new society, laments that courageous people are in short supply.

This dialogue plunges us into the time of emerging war memoirs as much as into Bernanos's novelistic and controversial work. Through the pages, we also encounter Churchill, Malraux, Claudel, Camus and Stefan Zweig.

Jean-Christophe Aeschlimann conducts a long interview in a captivating journey around countries and continents, between the dying old world and the emerging new one.

Alexandre Adler lifts the veil on Vladimir Putin, son of Yakov Broverman, Soviet counter-espionage chief from 1943 to 1945. He also recalls the Engadine, and Sils-Maria, in the memory of Anne Frank, who stayed there, and where a vision of happiness and utopia yet to come is clearly expressed.


Short Stories of the Working Class

An honest account, where the author reflects on his past and the birth of a humanist political identity where solidarity remains paramount.

They're not memories, just stories. They are as true as a memory can be. I lived them or heard them from people close to me. These stories have shaped and taught me, so I wanted to recount them. From my grandfather's childhood to the days of a young delivery man on strike, the thread that links these stories is red, like a workers' struggle.


A collection of fruity, scholarly and witty texts by a free-spirited author who will not stop at one subject, or a single form of writing.

A hybrid creation, as if spawned from the love affair between a dachshund and an Afghan greyhound, this book offers a patchwork of genres and topics: pop culture pieces, essays on art and literature, fiction crafted from the works of contemporary artists, DIY poems using found materials, and the last confession of a mother to her now grown children, about a disappearing pair of guinea pigs.

In eleven chapters, Louis Loup Collet offers a breviary of his literary, artistic and philosophical experiences. Among others, he evokes Nietzsche, Isaac Asimov and Agota Kristof, and presents his method for marking his progress through a book - never a bookmark, but a double system for cornering the paper.

He also addresses overlooked questions: what does Top, the dog in *The Mysterious Island*, do when Jules Verne doesn't mention him?

After-rain Tenderness

A Swiss painter in an artist's residence in Finland. Describing what he sees, he invents witnesses to relate the history of this region.

What does such a low sun do to a painter? A veterant of many stays in european cities, once he's got his bearings, Luc Marelli widens his circle. Walks in the cold, encounters along an abandoned railway line, friendships made in train stations. He finds warmth in museums and libraries.


Then the circle widens through time. Characters recount the country's history. The recent story of the railroad abandonment. The older tale of a piece of territory lost during a war. This time, it's a frontier that jumps over lives and villages.

Perrine Le Querrec Les pistes Tracks

Three protagonists in 42 parallel universes, and ever-present death, blood, love and dreams.

Eva, Piotr, Tom. A woman, a man, a child. Thrown into these parallel universes where life manifests itself, a life drawn in by death, where love sways, violence lurks, threatens, rises.

Here Eva grabs a glass, Piotr buttons his shirt, little Tom presses the pedals on his bike. Actions are made and unmade. Feelings are born, are crushed, survive, collapse. It's night, it's day. The future is played out before the past, and the past is still lived in the present. Everything repeats itself, nothing is identical. What remains is writing, signs dancing on the trembling page, and an intriguing echo rising up.


Four sci-fi scenarios to put a notorious dictator to death: Volodia.

A team of scientists discuss the best way to execute a paranoid, deluded dictator who has invaded a neighboring country in the name of some obscure idea of geohistorical grandeur. Four options are tested and discussed: in a subterranean labyrinth; in a bizarre ivory tower; in a giant aquarium before the eyes of the United Nations Assembly; and, of course, with purifying ancestral fire.

Nourished by obscene medieval tales, whether philosophical or cathartic, this novel reminds us that capital punishment remains a narratable tale.

Between dreams of memories and the harsh reality of war, a rediscovery of Moscow and Russia.

Isabelle Cornaz has lived for many years in Moscow, where she worked as a journalist. Recalling the details of her life there, she draws here an ambiguous portrait of the city. She reveals Moscow's inner core, its courtyards, invisible places, and the signs of its gentrification. The narrative shifts punctually away from the capital, from the suburbs to the Arctic Circle, flying over Russia's secret cities.

La nuit au pas is a story about our relationship with space, memories and disappearance.

Pierrine Poget Inachevée, vivante Unfinished, Alive

A feminine perspective and a unique way of describing a life's struggle to reclaim one's body and mind, too often surrendered to others.

The book opens with the violent memory of a sexual assault suffered by the narrator, convinced that she has missed her chance to say no. Through her language, the author will then reclaim her body and her power of decision.

The text then leaves this violent memory to expand on one's complex relationship with motherhood. By diving into a childlike cocoon, renouncing desire and living at the child's pace, the author gradually abandons the adult world and deludes herself into a return to the innocence and immortality of childhood.

Corinne Desarzens Un Noël avec Winston A Christmas with Winston

An intimate portrait of a man of excesses. Beyond his qualities and faults lay a savage, a phoenix, a being that nothing could bring down.

Turning her back on a linear biography in favour of a freer form, Corinne Desarzens welcomes the decisive moments, the anecdotes and the stories that draw the monstrous portrait of a brilliant and unpredictable Winston Churchill.

We discover, following the sequences of his life, the tensions during the vote to replace Chamberlain, the atmosphere of the Yalta Conference, the mnemonic methods of the old lion to remember his 1700 speeches, what fueled him, his home which was a world in and of itself, his debts...

Born in 1936 to Italian parents, **Anne Cuneo** was a writer of literary and documentary pieces. She wrote and directed for radio, television and theatre. After a first cycle of autobiographical novels, Anne Cuneo explored historical fiction and made it her own: a story anchored in reality but able to take liberties with it to highlight certain aspects. Anne Cuneo is also the author of a series of crime novels firmly rooted in our social realities.

Anne Cuneo's first published title. An autobiographical novel inspired by André Breton's *Nadja*, dotted with essential social issues.

Zurich, Spring 1963, a day in the life of Lise, an editor in an advertising agency. Her wounded soul, her 'atrophied psyche', she tries to heal it by delving into her past: the death of her father when she was only 9 years old, the successive religious boarding schools that were more prisons than schools, her arrival in Switzerland with everything to prove, her lack of experience with love, the multiple attempts at writing... until her personal emancipation.

Anne Cuneo's first printed title. After its publication, *Gravé au diamant* was so well received that the Radio Suisse Romande created a prize for it, the **Anti-Prix de la Radio Romande**.

In this second opus of her life story, originally intended to be a private confession, Anne Cuneo gives us access to the last years of her childhood.

'Anna' was eleven years old when she saw Lausanne for the first time. A Milanese girl from a good family who had lost her father three years earlier in atrocious circumstances. She was raised by her mother and lived for a long time in a sad boarding house for Italian girls.

It was in Catholic School that Anne Cuneo blossomed. She learned French better than anyone else, became interested in literature, lost her faith and discovered the need to travel.

Garamond's Master

A journey to the sources of modern typography, printing and publishing, and the beginnings of a new humanist school of thought.

On the evening of 24 December 1534, a man suspected of heresy was hanged in Paris, Place Maubert: Antoine Augereau, printer, publisher and punchcutter. His body and books were then burned. He was accused, as a scapegoat, of being the author and printor of the anti-catholic *Placards* (posters).

Antoine Augereau created and passed on the typefaces that have - directly or indirectly - shaped those we still use today. His story is told by the most famous of his apprentices, Claude Garamond, who simultaneously tells his own.

Amalia can be called anything but lazy: there is much energy and curiosity in this fourteen-year-old girl arriving in London alone and penniless on that fateful day in March 1954. With ten words of English in her pocket, she quickly meets Victoria Brown, an octogenarian suffragette, who relives her flamboyant past by taking the young Amalia under her wing and sharing everything that she knows and has lived, from literature to sexual experiences.

For a teenager in search of an identity, Miss Brown ends up being a sublime mentor, finding a new lease of life by imparting her precious stories and advice to her new young friend.

Antipodes was founded in 1995. Publishing around twenty books per year, their catalogue includes over 300 titles, mainly in the domain of social sciences: history, sociology, anthropology, philosophy, political science, psychology, but also comics and graphic novels with the Trajectoires collection and a new children's collection, Petitpodes.



Morgane Gay-Bianco OSS 117, l'espion est-il mat ? OSS 117, is the Spy Checkmate?

The successful OSS 117 series is an ideal vehicle for exploring the interplay between the political landscape of post-World War II France and the evolution of Cold War cultures.

Jean and Josette Bruce published more than 240 OSS 117 novels between 1949 and 1972, all starring CIA spy Hubert Bonisseur de la Bath, who travels through a stereotyped, exotic and eroticized universe to safeguard the Free World. Following a well-established recipe, each episode is a game of chess where readers are familiar with the rules and subtleties, and know the winner in advance.

The evolution of this paraliterary genre followed the mutations of Cold War cultures, encouraged by manicheistic visions of the threats and tensions between the two Blocks.

Chinese women in Switzerland

The first study on the migration of Chinese women in Switzerland, providing an analysis of the power imbalances they experience.

This research provides a panorama of the rich life paths of the Chinese women who live in Switzeland, through a series of testimonies in which they evoke the various discriminations associated with gender, race, class, nationality or origin they suffered from.

The migratory life of these women is illustrated through different dimensions: matrimonial and familial; professional and economic; political or socio-cultural, in order to give visibility to this minority group of migrant women.

A publishing house that reflects its books, small, but of high quality. Since 1997, for **d'autre part**, the emphasis has been on the quality of the text, naturally, but also on the book itself. Absolutely everything, from ideas to words to éditions d'autre part paper, is made in Switzerland, with infinite care. Their work has brought to light several award-winning authors of fiction, whose reputation is now well established.

A farmer has lost his farm after fifty years of hard work: facing idleness, despairingly, his heart cries out for more.

'dèdè' leaves his farm, his animals, his mountain, and despite his age, sets out on the road, braving the cold weather and new adversities.

Two women will cross his path. The first, married to a powerful but boring man, worships our protagonist's talent as a writer. She will offer him admiration, stimulating conversation, luxury and pleasure. The second, a worker in an industrial bakery, will bring him joy and spontaneity, and a way of living life one day at a time.

Tender Rocks simply and delicately recounts the memories of a house destined to disappear.

The story begins with the disappearance of Grace, the narrator's wife. Distraught, he will return to his childhood home - Le Clos - in order to trace their relationship back to the moment they met. This place is home not only to the seeds of their love but to a great many other stories.

A poetic tale rather than a novel, Tender Rocks renders the still glowing embers of childhood, in a house at the foot of a steep cliff. The narrator pieces together the lives of three generations and the flames of a love that has stood the test of time.

Five short stories relating the ordeals, political scandals and horrors of humanitarian disasters in the Sahel region.

Nétonon Noël Ndjékéry plunges into the lives of the powerless and the powerful, of the unfortunate who suffer endemic famines, those who silently rebel, and those who are just waiting for their *minute* of glory, or death.

Those stories are an unflinching critique of a region that can only be called an "open-air laboratory of the Devil". In the midst of civil wars, military excesses, droughts and famines, men and women are paying a heavy toll for the inability, or impossibility, to work for the common good, even when opportunities present themselves.

K as in Almanac

A dystopian fable that is both social and intimate, confronting us with questions of inheritance, trust and family in times of crisis.

Buildings are cracking, the city is being eaten away by choking vegetation, supplies are running out and any future prospects are vanishing. The population is moving en masse to the idealized *Belgador*, never to return.

Simon, a lamplighter, has no intention of abandoning his town and its last inhabitants. He continues to fight against the growing darkness, and sets out to pass on to an abandoned child what he values most: a job well done, caring for others, and language.

Across two centuries, two million Swiss mercenaries have served the kings and queens of Europe. Daniel de Roulet recounts the suffering, love and heroism of eight of them.

The story of the red cap is linked to the Swiss mercenaries, hired to defend royalty at the start of the French Revolution. Some of these soldiers rebelled, and took their officers hostage. For this, they were sentenced to death, torture, or a lifetime of servitude.

When the rebellious Swiss, imprisoned in Brest, were later pardoned by the National Assembly, they became heroes of the people, bearers of the revolutionary spirit and the famed red cap.


Jean Starobinski **Histoire de la médecine** *History of Medicine*

A brief illustrated encyclopedia of the history of medicine up to the 20th century.

For essayist and critic Jean Starobinski, the history of medicine is at the exact crossroads of his education and interests as a doctor, literary critic and historian of ideas and science. The philosopher dreamed of a borderless history that would bridge the different domains of knowledge.

He invites us both to a philosophical examination of the fundamental values of our existence, and to a critical awareness of medicine, suggesting that the latter "will only make us happier if we know exactly what to ask of it."

Attempting to grasp the global dimension of the cairn through its relationship with places and people.

Markers of a tangible geography, cairns tell the world as it is. In the Himalayas, the Alps and Lapland, on the trails of ancient Celtic countries and among American Indians, they indicate a border, mark the way, mark the crossing of a pass, a grave or a hunting ground.

Alexandre Chollier combines his analysis with anthropological, philosophical and sociological references, and offers a wide range of references from his own research. Punctuated by the drawings of Marc de Bernardis, *Autour du cairn* summons places, stories and the voices of poets, anthropologists and philosophers to make the "voice of the stones" heard.

A Postman's Life

The career of a mailman, from a golden age to the dehumanization of the profession.

Jean-Jacques Kissling recounts the daily life and evolution of the mailman's craft: anecdotes from his rounds, customers who never fail to offer a drink, sometimes extreme working conditions...

The profession then evolves. Technological advances simplify the job and alienate workers, while ever more restrictive regulations undermine the social and human aspects that once made a mailman much more than a simple mail deliverer: he was a messenger, a peddler of oral as well as written news, the keeper of a social bond that is disappearing today.

And then there's the system of alternating rounds, which forces mailmen to change routes every three to four weeks. As a result, the mailmen know their customers less well, and people no longer know their letter carrier.






